#### Upcoming Bylaws Implementation: Pediatric Transplant Component



- Implementation Plan:
  - Aug. 1, 2019 Members received 30-day advance notice of upcoming application period (already done)
  - Sept. 3, 2019 90-day application period began
  - Dec. 3, 2019 Applications due
  - Staff and MPSC review applications
  - The <u>earliest possible</u> Board approval of applications and implementation of bylaws December 2020

## **Approved Primary Personnel**

- To be a primary physician or surgeon under the pediatric component bylaws, there are two general sets of requirements:
  - 1. Primary personnel requirements
  - 2. Pediatric specific requirements
- If already approved as primary surgeon or physician, you do not need to document that you meet current primary personnel requirements
  - Kidney, liver, and heart pediatric key personnel will need to meet the additional pediatric specific requirements

# Pediatric Specific Requirements - Kidney

You are applying to be:	Pediatric Specific Requirements are:
Primary Pediatric Kidney <b>Surgeon</b>	<ul> <li>10 kidney transplants in patients less than 18 years old, including 3 transplants in patients less than 6 years old or weighing less than 25 kilograms</li> <li>Maintained a current working knowledge of pediatric kidney transplantation, defined as direct involvement in pediatric kidney transplant patient care, in the last 2 years</li> </ul>
Primary Pediatric Kidney <b>Physician</b>	<ul> <li>Must have completed at least one of the following pathways:</li> <li>3-year Pediatric Nephrology Fellowship Pathway</li> <li>12-month Pediatric Transplant Nephrology Fellowship Pathway</li> <li>Combined Pediatric Nephrology Training and Experience Pathway</li> </ul>

### Pediatric Specific Requirements - Liver

You are applying to be:	Pediatric Specific Requirements are:	
Primary Pediatric Liver <b>Surgeon</b>	<ul> <li>15 liver transplants in patients less than 18 years old, including 8 transplants in patients less than 6 years old or weighing less than 25 kilograms</li> <li>Maintained a current working knowledge of pediatric liver transplantation, defined as direct involvement in pediatric liver transplant patient care, in the last 2 years</li> </ul>	
Primary Pediatric Liver <b>Physician</b>	<ul> <li>Must have completed at least one of the following pathways:</li> <li>3-year Pediatric Gastroenterology Fellowship Pathway</li> <li>Pediatric Transplant Hepatology Fellowship Pathway</li> <li>Combined Pediatric Gastroenterology/Transplant Hepatology Training and Experience Pathway</li> </ul>	

### Pediatric Specific Requirements - Heart

You are applying to be:	Pediatric Specific Requirements are:
Primary Pediatric Heart <b>Surgeon</b>	<ul> <li>8 heart transplants in patients less than 18 years old, including 4 transplants in patients less than 6 years old or weighing less than 25 kilograms</li> <li>Maintained a current working knowledge of pediatric heart transplantation, defined as direct involvement in pediatric heart transplant patient care, in the last 2 years</li> </ul>
Primary Pediatric Heart <b>Physician</b>	<ul> <li>Current certification in pediatric cardiology by the American Board of Pediatrics</li> <li>Directly involved in the primary care of at least 8 heart transplant patients less than 18 years old, including 4 transplants in patients less than 6 years old or weighing less than 25 kilograms</li> <li>Maintained a current working knowledge of pediatric heart transplantation, defined as direct involvement in pediatric heart transplant patient care, in the last 2 years</li> </ul>

## Lung and Pancreas

- No pediatric-specific requirements for primary personnel
- No additional requirements for individuals who are already approved as primary personnel
  - Still required to complete an application for a pediatric component
- Individuals who are not already approved as primary personnel will need to meet the current primary personnel requirements.
