Introduction

The Transplant Coordinators Committee met via Citrix GoToMeeting teleconference on 01/15/2020 to discuss the following agenda items:

The following is a summary of the Committee's discussions.

1. Synopsis of public comment provided to the OPTN Liver & Intestine Committee

The committee chair presented the public comment prepared by committee members in response to the Liver and Intestine Committee's policy, "Access for Urgent Liver Candidates in Hawaii and Puerto Rico".

Data summary:

The committee is in strong support of the proposal, and believes it will improve transplant access and help to correct the current inequity caused by geography. The committee believes that the Liver and Intestine Committee should carefully consider backup strategies for liver offers that fall under this policy. This committee also recommended post-implementation monitoring metrics.

Summary of discussion:

No questions or concerns were raised.

2. Public Comment Proposals Winter 2020 – Survey Results and Review Groups

The committee chair presented the results of the committee's internal survey on what policies they are most interested in reviewing at the upcoming in-person meeting.

Data summary:

The committee is most in interest of hearing presentations on the following proposals:

- Modifications to Released Kidney and Pancreas Allocation
- Modify Blood Type Determination and Reporting Policies

Summary of discussion:

22, 2020, and consider specific feedback sought by the sponsoring committee of the proposal. At the in-person meeting on February 26, 2020, the review teams will present their feedback.
