OPTN Ad Hoc Disease Transmission Advisory Committee Meeting Summary July 27, 2020 Conference Call

Introduction

The Ad Hoc Disease Transmission Advisory Committee met via Citrix GoToMeeting teleconference on 07/27/2020 to discuss the following agenda items:

1. Discuss Changes to PHS Public Comment Proposal

UNOS staff presented on changes to PHS Public Comment proposal following additional legal review.

Summary of discussion:

Committee members would like to require Hepatitis B (HBV) vaccination. Since the OPTN does not currently have the authority to do so, they would like to implement mandatory data collection around candidate vaccination status. They want to ensure that it is mandatory so that there isn't a bias in reporting, with programs only reporting candidates who are vaccinated. Committee members would also like to know if it is possible to require other vaccinations be documented in candidate charts.

Committee members also expressed interest in requesting or pursuing secretarial intervention for the OPTN to have authority to require candidate HBV vaccination.

Vote to send revised policy language to Public Comment: 15 yes, 0 abstain, 0 no.

Next steps:

UNOS staff will send the revised policy language to Public Comment for community review and feedback. UNOS staff will consult with legal to see the amount of vaccination documentation the OPTN can require.

2. Closed Session: Confidential Peer Case Review
