# Purpose of Proposal

#### Purpose

 This proposal will update the current policies for consistency and ensure a valid and unbiased pronouncement of death

#### Proposal

 Revises policies to clearly outline responsibilities of individuals that may be employed at a donor hospital and by the organ procurement organization (OPO) in the context of donor pronouncement of death.

## Rationale

- OPOs employ or contract with multiple physicians who are hospital intensivists to provide on-call medical director services who may need to participate in donation after circulatory death (DCD) pronouncement of death, when not on-call for the OPO, as part of the donor's hospital healthcare team.
- The language in Policy 2.15 G Pronouncement of Death is broad and does not provide adequate clarity for OPOs and the OPTN Membership and Professional Standards Committee (MPSC) to determine if the policy has been violated.

## **Proposal**

#### Policy 2.14.A: Conflicts of Interest

- Removed "time of death" to be consistent with *Policy 2.15.G: Pronouncement of Death*.
- Added reference to hospital policy and state/local statutes or regulations to be consistent with Policy 2.15.G: Pronouncement of Death.
- Removed reference to physician and attending physician since various healthcare professionals are authorized to declare death.

#### Policy 2.15.G: Pronouncement of Death

- Modified language to be donor-specific.
- Replaced donor hospital healthcare team member who "is authorized to declare death" with "who declares death" to be specific to that donor.

## Member Actions

- OPOs may need to evaluate their internal policies and procedures to account for this policy change.
- Transplant hospitals may need to evaluate their internal policies and procedures to account for this policy change.

# What do you think?

- Are there any concerns about these changes impacting patient or donor care?
- Are there any ethical considerations with these changes?
- Does the proposed policy language provide adequate clarity for donor hospital healthcare workers who may also provide on-call support for OPOs?
- Does this proposal help increase or maintain the public trust in the declaration of death of potential organ donors?
