

and accountability.








Modernization Approach

Previous Approach

Single Contract required expertise across all domains



3. Structured to maintain the status quo



Modernized Approach

1. Multiple, tailored contracts to harness domain-specific, best-in-class expertise



2. Expands pool of expertise across industry by opening eligibility to For-Profit and Non-Profit



3. Design focuses on accountability, transparency, continuous improvement, and innovation

Supporting System Performance and Equity

Consistent with HHS goals to improve organ transplant system performance and equity, HRSA and CMS have determined the need for additional OPTN data:

Pre-Waitlist Data

 Several OPTN committees and stakeholders have documented inequities in access to transplantation and substantial variation in practice across transplant programs with respect to transplant access.

OPO Donor Potential Data

 Enhanced data collection will better support the CMS Condition for Coverage that requires OPOs to report certain data on potential deceased donors.





Pre-Waitlist Data Collection

- HRSA's directive for this data collection was informed by recommendations from various OPTN committees and stakeholders, including the Data Advisory, Minority Affairs, Ethics, and Patient Affairs Committees.
- Proposed Referral and Evaluation Registration Form data collection:
 - 1. Date of referral
 - 2. Date of first visit
 - 3. Date for beginning formal transplant evaluation, and
 - 4. Referring provider number (CMS Certification Number, or CCN).
- Aligns with HRSA OPTN modernization efforts and will increase data transparency, support improvement activities, and inform OPTN performance measure development.





OPO Donor Potential Data Collection

- All OPOs collect process data beginning with each referral call through death record reviews and audits of missed referrals; however, these data are not available to the OPTN, HRSA/CMS, donor patient families, or the public.
- HRSA's directive for this data collection aligns with OPTN Membership and Professional Standards Committee's (MPSC) OPO Performance Monitoring Metric Workgroup efforts.
- Proposed Ventilated Patient Form data collection:
 - Time of Ventilated Referral
 - Date of Death Record Review
 - Procurement Process data
 - Donor Management data
- This data will provide a more systematic understanding of donor hospital referral and organ
 procurement practices and their impact on transplant access.

Next Steps

- HRSA will direct the OPTN contractor to develop new, proposed data reporting forms.
- HRSA will issue a Federal Register Notice soliciting public comment in the Summer.
- HRSA will direct OPTN contractor to update systems and processes to support data collection, including providing training and resources to facilitate accurate, timely submissions.
- New data collection is expected to be implemented in September 2024, pending OMB approval.
