OPTN Vision


We collectively support maximized organ donation, effective and safe care, and equitable organ allocation and access to transplantation in ways that are transparent, inclusive, and enhance public trust in the national organ donation and transplantation system.

OPTN Modernization

As part of its Congressionally mandated OPTN oversight role, HRSA will manage the Modernization through:

- **Oversight and compliance monitoring of OPTN components; improvements in outcomes** in adherence to federal statute, Congressional mandates, and the Federal Acquisition Regulation governing federal contracts
- Incorporation and designation of the OPTN Board of Directors
- **A new operating model** that reduces the risks and challenges inherent in the current structure
- A more strategic procurement process to obtain support of best-in-class contracted experts and reduce conflicts of interest
- Direct support to the OPTN Board of Directors
- Other expert teams to work exclusively on operational improvements (e.g., matching system/data, communications, transformation services)
- Deliberate and monitored approach to transition contractors and implement system changes with a focus on "do no harm"







OPTN Board of Directors Incorporation

HRSA supported the incorporation of the OPTN Board of Directors as a distinct entity with the necessary resources and support to fulfill its responsibilities, that

- Ensures that the OPTN Board is separated from the corporate board of OPTN contractors
- Safeguards against conflicts of interest and undue influence from OPTN contractors or industry
- Allows the volunteers who make up the OPTN Board to focus on their statutory responsibilities of developing and governing organ allocation policies, membership criteria and membership standards
- Improves HRSA's ability to maintain oversight over the OPTN as a whole
- Facilitates greater collaboration between the OPTN Board of Directors and HRSA to ensure a fair, transparent, and effective organ procurement and transplantation system

Liability Insurance Coverage for Volunteers

The **Board has liability insurance** as the governing body that makes policy decisions for the OPTN





Independent Network of Volunteers for Equitable and Safe Transplants, Inc. (INVEST)

- INVEST is a nonprofit corporation whose sole purpose is to serve as the Board of Directors of the OPTN through the HRSA designation contract
- Incorporated in Delaware on May 23, 2024
- Members and officers of the current OPTN Board are now members and officers of the new entity INVEST
- The OPTN members will elect the OPTN Board of Directors





Designation and Ongoing Governance





Bylaws and Policies

- HRSA worked with the OPTN officials to align existing bylaws and procedures
- INVEST is required to have bylaws as an incorporated 501c3
- The existing OPTN bylaws were split into bylaws and policies
 - OPTN management and membership policies
 - OPTN organ allocation policies
- INVEST bylaws and policies became OPTN bylaws and policies when the INVEST was designated as the OPTN Board of Directors





Designation of New Entity

- The government uses contracts to work with other organizations in a formal capacity
- As the federal designee to oversee the OPTN, HRSA issued a "designation contract" to formalize the relationship with the nonprofit entity INVEST
 - Designated INVEST to operate as the OPTN Board of Directors
 - Defines roles and responsibilities
- HRSA will meet with Board on a quarterly basis
 - Review operational support Board receives from contractors
 - Enhance collaboration in the multi-vendor environment
 - Work collaboratively on the implementation of NOTA requirements, directors of the Secretary, and other applicable laws









- Select an interim OPTN Executive Director
- Award a Board Support contract in Fall 2024
- Recruit a new OPTN Executive Director
- Develop a new process and hold a special election for OPTN Board members






OPTN Regional Meetings
